We recommend that the SROs:

- a) Approve / Support \$200,000 from the PG5 fund towards the Accelerate25 Delivery Action Plan project on the basis that funding will assist with the acceleration of development and implementation of growth strategies for the Manawatū Whanganui region over the 2 year timeframe.
- b) Note grant funding is the proposed funding structure, Commercial Information
- c) Note the application should be considered as part of the support allocation of \$\frac{commercial}{2}\$ p.a. for EDAs which was signed off on the by the USEC on 18th December 2018.

Proposal:

Delivery of the Manawatū-Whanganui Economic Action Plan, involving the identification of regional priorities including both growth opportunities and enablers of growth, along with project delivery teams. It involves collaboration between iwi, business, local and central government, with co-ordination provided by Horizons Regional Council.

Assessment against the PGF criteria:

Eligibility Criteria

The application has been assessed as meeting the PGF eligibility criteria. The proposed activities are the responsibility of the regional council but are central to the objectives of the PGF (i.e., identifying and developing enablers of growth).
