It is expected the expanded processing facility will provide the necessary additional capacity for the district and act as a beachhead for this industry in the Wairoa district.

This model is well established in horticulture and the facility will offer toll-processing to all lime growers in and around Wairoa.

At present the Limery employs commerce full time staff and offer casual seasonal work (up to commerce). The expanded project also includes costs.
