## Background:

- Development Project Report (RDPR) identifying a number of opportunities in Eastern Bay of Plenty to increase economic output and generate jobs. Specifically, the RDPR identified 65 opportunities across a number of industries and sectors to create up to Commercial FTE positions and \$Commercial in economic output per annum.
- This project proposes either the hiring of a consultant or the creation of Commercial Information to manage this portfolio of 65 opportunities across the life of the PGF (up to September 2020 at the earliest). The primary role of this proposed position is to liaise with local lwi and other interested parties to help develop these projects and submit them to the PGF with an end goal of implementation. This funding will also fund the

# We recommend that the SRO:

- a) Discuss the application from the Opotiki District Council for the creation of a Regional Development Project Implementation position.
- b) Note that the PDU Investment Team assessed the application and has concluded that there is alignment with the criteria of the PGF. Specifically the project will work to progress a number of projects in Eastern Bay of Plenty that will:
  - Significantly impact employment opportunities and;
  - Significantly impact the economic prospects of the region.
- c) Note the proposal is seeking with the total project costs. For grants the PGF requires co-funding.
- d) Note all regional EDA's are to be allocated \$\(^{\text{commercial Inform}}\) to help create a resource for potential PGF applications. Part of this funding could be appropriated from Bay of Plenty's allocation.
- e) Approve \$237,500 from the PGF fund towards the Eastern Bay of Plenty - Regional Development Project Implementation on the basis that:
  - i) The project is reviewed at the end of each year with progress reported to the

creation of a report to government that provides updates on progress of the project portfolio and its delivering of the objectives of the PGF.

 This position and will be augmented and supported by in-kind contributions of staff time from the Kawerau, Opotiki, and Whakatāne District Councils, the BOP Regional Council, and Toi EDA. PDU. Any future funding is to be contingent on this progress.

- ii) Any resource employed is done so through appropriate avenues and follows a robust employment process.
- iii) The applicant ensures that the project is sustainable beyond the current term of the PGF, or all work is completed by September 2020.

### Eligibility points of note:

- Due diligence: As the applicant is a consortium of local authorities full due diligence is not necessary.
- Conflict(s) of interest: Based on the information provided no conflict of interest is evident noting that full due diligence will inform this item further.
- Illegal Activity: Based on the application information provided and feedback from other agencies there is no indication that the applicant or project has been involved in, or associated with illegal activity.
- Alignment with Regional development plans: This project helps to develop a range of projects which are
  directly identified in regional development plans as key projects for the region. In addition, many of the
  projects are in key industries identified as growth sectors in regional economic development plans.
- Commercial funding availability: This project works to manage, develop a portfolio of projects, and liaise with local authorities and interest groups. Due to the public nature of this role and the potential for conflicts of interest where commercial funding is sought, commercial funding is not considered feasible.
