ASET currently helps Tairawhiti's harder to place workforce members through training and support services. ASET are seeking PGF funding to significantly scale up their food processing facility that is used to provide employment and training opportunities for people in their programme. PGF funding will act as an enabler and catalyst for ASET. It will increase the Trust's ability via capacity to employ and offer services to more of Tairawhiti's hardest to place workforce. ASET's model has elements of social enterprise, seeking commercial outcomes while incorporating social benefits (training people and pastoral care). This mix of Trust goals makes it difficult to access commercial funding. This project was approved for funding on 5 November 2018 by RED Ministers, but without a specific funding amount. | | | | Commercial Information The PDU is seeking support for its recommendations in relation to: - The amount; and - Mechanism to fund ASET. | The PDU also recommends a construction plan milestone-based funding agreement, based on a per cent initial payment on signing of the agreement followed by three payments across the construction period, holding back \$ for the final report. The PDU further recommends a loan tied to revenue generation (to be developed with the applicant). This acknowledges ASET provides strong social services to the community and is not likely to hit commercial revenue levels in the short to medium term. ASET have gained a reputation for good results and has a MSD work place contract to provide social services. ASET has also received funding from HPR (\$). MFAT understands this funding is to construct a food processing facility, with other sources being used to support the employment and training aspects of the application. As the funding mix with include a grant and loan, this is a subsidy under the SCM. If the subsidy is contingent on expanding exports, then there is a risk of it being a prohibited export subsidy. Since the funding is to be used for building a food processing facility, the disciplines of the Agreement on Agriculture also apply. As a direct payment to a factor of production (capital), there is a high risk of this falling into the Amber Box, contrary to our existing trade policy settings. This risk is mitigated somewhat by the scale of the proposal and its community-based themes, including supplying domestic retailers with produce. Providing funding for capital expenditure on a commercial basis (in which no subsidy would arise). If a commercial loan is not possible, seek to re-shape the application to focus output on domestic sales rather than exports. SkyTEM (\$2,154,000): Aquifer mapping project delivering spatially dense, 3D maps of entire aquifer systems, for high resolution identification of aquifer properties to depths of at least 300 metres. This application forms part of the HBRC Water Security Package, and should be considered in conjunction with the project Hawke's Bay Water – Tukituki and Heretaunga projects. 
