#### Recommendations

It is recommended that Regional Economic Development Ministers:

#### Projects recommended for approval

- 1. **Note** that the Provincial Development Unit (PDU) has assessed five proposals seeking a total of up to \$Commercial Information of funding from the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF).
- 2. **Note** that the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) has assessed a further three proposals seeking a total of \$Commercial Information of this funding from the PGF.



#### Cook's Landing restoration - Tairāwhiti

9. **Note** that PDU and the Independent Advisory Panel recommend that Ministers support funding for \$1.630 million from the PGF towards the Cook's Landing Restoration Project.

#### 28<sup>th</sup> Māori Battalion – Northland

21. **Note** that one of the Government's commitments outlined in the Coalition Agreement between Labour and New Zealand First is to "build a museum to commemorate the 28th Māori Battalion at Waitangi" (the Museum).

22. **Note** that the final business case for the Museum has been received and confirms the total cost of the project will be \$14.500 million with all funding to be requested from the PGF.

23. **Note** that the business case does not provide evidence of the level of economic and productivity benefits expected from PGF projects (e.g. no plan to increase the admission cost of visiting the Treaty grounds post completion of the Museum). Additionality benefits are available based on improving the overall experience of visitors to the Treaty of Waitangi grounds. Tourism was identified as a major potential opportunity for development for Northland.

24. **Note** that funding up to \$509,000 has already been approved by the Senior Regional Officials (in two tranches) to support Stage One planning, resource consent, design and regional consultation for the Museum:

25. **Agree** to support the 28th Māori Battalion Museum proposal and funding of \$13.991 million from the PGF to complete the Museum project.

- 26. **Agree** to direct the PDU to prepare full investment agreements, by way of a grant, for the Māori Battalion Museum to a value of up to \$13.991 million and executing the agreements subject to:
  - Support for the Museum being obtained from the representatives of the 28th Māori Battalion companies (A Company (Te Tai Tokerau Association),B Company (History Trust, Rotorua),C Company (Nga Taonga a Nga Tama Toa Trust) and D Company, Wellington) and Head Quarters Company) prior to construction commencing;
  - The resource consent application for the Museum being approved by Far North District Council;
  - A representative from MBIE with experience in building and quantity surveying to continue supporting the Steering Group for the project on the capital building components of the project;
  - The Waitangi National Trust Board providing confidential updates to MBIE on the progress of the Serious Fraud Office investigation the Board initiated concerning financial irregularities identified through the Board's internal audits.

28. **Note** that Cabinet has given interim authority to delegated RED Ministers (RED, Economic Development, Finance, Transport) to approve applications for afforestation proposals under the One Billion Trees Programme of between \$1 million and \$20 million (CAB-18-MIN-0045 refers).

#### Land Information New Zealand – New Zealand regional elevation data proposal

34. **Note** the information provided on LINZ's coordinated capture of regional elevation data (in 3D) project.

  - Option 1: a three year project would fund coverage for surge regions and regions ready to enter into co-funding partnerships seeking \$\s^{\text{Commercial Information}}\$ from the PGF.
  - Option 2: a five year project would fund coverage over nearly all of provincial New Zealand seeking \$ from the PGF, noting that this would require approval from Cabinet.



 Option 3: a five year project – would fund coverage over nearly all of provincial New Zealand – requiring \$ from the PGF and \$ of extra co-funding from Commercial Information

#### Investment Statement for the Provincial Growth Fund

  - Geographic scope: Auckland, Wellington (including Hutt and Porirua) and Christchurch (which includes Banks Peninsula) are excluded; Wairarapa is included and surge regions are prioritised over other regions;
  - Regional Action Plans have an important role in the context of the PGF;
  - Capability development: there is a need to focus on the long-term sustainability of capability investments and encourage the development of skills that relate to the Future of Work;
  - Sector and infrastructure priorities: tourism, forestry, food and beverage shifting to value over volume, digital enablement and transport investments focused on supporting regional economic development.



42. **Agree** that Territorial Authorities and provincial towns with high NEETs, low median incomes and a decreasing number of businesses are also priorities for the PGF.
