It is recommended that: SROs

Support the PDU recommendation to approve \$400,000 grant from the PGF fund towards a Regional Digital Hub in Wairoa, noting:

- This is in line with the PGF allocated funding for Regional Digital Hubs (RDHs) in that it:
 - o Is located in a key service town in a rural area
 - Will provide digital connectivity and create a place for business and community activity
- A regional digital hub will contribute significantly to the uplift of digital capability in Wairoa and nearby areas.

Funding conditions:

- Confirmation of co-funding
- Commitment to fund any shortfall if sponsorship is not adequate
- PDU approval of the final governance structure, expected project deliverables and financials
 - Commercial Information

Note the Wairoa Revitalisation Project has been approved by RED Ministers which may impact the location of the RDH longterm. WDC has identified a possible alternative site that will not impact the hub's effectiveness in uplifting digital capability in Wairoa and the surrounding rural areas.

How does the project demonstrate:

	Accessibility: How does the initiative remove or reduce barriers to digital connectivity local communities and businesses currently face, and, promote opportunities associated with digital connectivity.	The RDH will aim to address some of the disparities Wairoa and the wider region experiences as a consequence of the digital divide. The RDH will address digital connectivity needs at a personal and community level as well as providing a facility for corporates and small businesses, thereby promoting improved growth and sustainability of new and existing businesses. The project will benefit the community as a digital hub feeds into the vision for Wairoa to use the library as a 'third place', a place that is not home, work or school but a third environment where people can connect.
*	Criticality: Is the regional digital hub a critical component for supporting a wider PGF investment in the region? How does the proposal promote wider regional goals?	Wairoa is one of the most isolated towns in NZ and with this geographical isolation comes significant disconnect with the rest of the country. The impact of these geographical challenges can be reduced though the provision of freely available digital services, particularly to local small business. Small businesses will be encouraged to make use of the RDH space, take part in workshops and classes and make use of business mentoring services. The combination of these services will help to facilitate small business incubation and development in Wairoa. Collaboration between businesses will also widen networks (e.g. to businesses in the Hawkes Bay) and consequently provide more opportunities for smaller businesses to learn and grow.
