

#### 5.3 Te Ara Mahi (TAM)/He Poutama Rangatahi (HPR) update

#### Ngā Pūmanawa Tūpuna (HPR)

Ngā Pūmanawa Tūpuna is a work-readiness He Poutama Rangatahi programme funded through the PGF, supporting the development of the essential soft skills necessary for success in the world of work. The programme, which was announced on 2 July 2019, targets 120 at risk rangatahi aged 16-24, predominantly but not exclusively Māori. The aim is to make the rangatahi not only more employable, but more confident, positive and productive members of society. Percent of participating rangatahi are expected to move into employment, further education, or training. Ngā Pūmanawa Tūpuna is delivered by Wairarapa Rural Education Activities Programme (REAP) Incorporated.

#### 6. Policy Updates

#### 6.1 Policy

#### **Upper North Island Supply Chain work programme to May 2020**

The Ministry of Transport, the Treasury, and the Provincial Development Unit continue to make good progress on with the UNISCS work programme.

Officials and consultants, including port engineers and a port planner, visited Northport, the Ports of Auckland and the Port of Tauranga last week. All three ports are now providing access to key information about current capacity and capital plans.

Auckland Mayor Phil Goff and the Chair of the Council's Planning Committee, Chris Darby, have written to Ministers following the recent officials' briefing to the Committee. While noting the briefing was useful, they express concern about the project's timeframes and have asked to meet with Ministers to discuss their concerns.

Ahead of your meeting on 2 March 2020, UNISCS Ministers will receive a briefing in response to your request at your 28 January meeting.

#### Government response to Trade for All Advisory Board Report

In November 2019, the Minister for Trade and Export Growth received the report of the Trade for All Advisory Board, which contained 53 recommendations to ensure that the benefits of international trade to New Zealand are spread more widely. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade has been developing a government response, which is currently scheduled to go to the Cabinet Economic Development Committee on 4 March.

In relation to economic development, the key findings of the report are that:

- building the number of export-capable companies of all sizes is the primary challenge to improving New Zealand's export performance
- the Government's vision to move the country's economic output from 'volume to value' is consistent with 'Trade for All' thinking
- New Zealand needs, and will continue to need, capital in many industries.

In relation to regional economic development, we have indicated the Provincial Development Unit seeks involvement in designing and implementing recommendations that have the potential to impact (either positively or negatively) the regions. Relevant recommendations relate to:

- encouraging inward and outward investment
- how relevant agencies prioritise and resource trade policy
- how the WTO and other international institutions address future challenges
- how New Zealand's value proposition is coordinated and advanced, incorporating a triple bottom line framework to meet social, environmental and economic objectives while being consistent with the Crown's partnership objectives under the Treaty
- an increased focus on the creative sector
- a more strategic approach to the tourism sector

- how NZTE interacts with and supports the tech sector
- a potential review of NZTE's focus on small to medium size enterprises
- how existing networks should coordinate in New Zealand's regions
- an increased focus on micro-exporting.

We note that the work programme indicated by the proposed government response is likely to have significant resource implications.

The Subscription Agreement for PGFL has now been signed, and you and the Minister of Finance (as PGFL shareholders) will soon be sent a briefing seeking approval to pay the call on shares. This will make funding available to PGFL to make payments under investment agreements that will be transferred to them.

The timing of the briefing is subject to when PGFL agrees to make the call on shares. Relevant documentation is currently with the Board for consideration. Once PGFL has the funds available, the PDU will commence the transfer of PGF investments to PGFL to hold.
