Formerly, such applications were enumerated as multiple applications and approvals. Some single applications resulting in multiple projects – or vice versa – also means that application numbers may differ from project numbers.

Project name	Description/ update
Northland Drought	Te Rarawa and Ngai Takato iwi have offered to supply water to drought-stricken towns, including Kaitaia and Kaikohe. The water will be sourced from an aquifer which runs through Sweetwater, an iwi-owned farm. This will require the installation of a four-kilometre long pipe, which will transport up to 2,700 cubic metres of water a day. The pipeline is expected to be completed within the next two weeks. The Hokianga Reference Group met on 20 February 2020. The Group discussed the water situation in the region and mitigation steps the Far North District Council is taking. The Group has formally noted the \$2.0m allocated to alleviate water stress in Kaitaia and Kaikohe.

A hui on rangatahi health services was held on 26 February. It involved all TAM and HPR providers in the region and representatives of the Hawke's Bay District Health Board (DHB).

The Hawke's Bay DHB is currently re-designing their services to rangatahi and the meeting provided an opportunity to discuss health and wellbeing-related challenges, particularly those related to drug use, faced by rangatahi on the pathway to employment, as well as ways these can be overcome.

The meeting also enabled better connections and collaboration between all providers and the DHB.
