PGFL investment sources

You and the Minister of Finance will soon receive a briefing seeking approval to modify the mandate of Provincial Growth Fund Limited (PGFL) to hold investments from non-PGF sources. This is in your capacity as shareholders of PGFL. The investments the briefing refers to include those funded from the Regional Investment Opportunities (RIO) Tagged Contingency. Documentation for Ministerial approval in this briefing will include a revised PGFL constitution and two subscription agreements for PGFL to accept and hold RIO and further PGF funded investments. PGFL urgently requires new subscription agreements to ensure that PGFL has the funding available to accept the novation of further PGF loan and equity investments and the cash available to make payments for RIO investments.

PDU staff have also been working with Treasury on the process for revising the indemnity for PGFL to reflect the change in the company's constitution. We understand that Treasury intends to provide a separate report to the Minister of Finance soon to consider granting a revised indemnity for PGFL.

Central Region Special Projects Skills Hub

The Central Region Special Projects Skills Hub application for \$1,039,436 was approved by RED Ministers on 7 May 2020. The Hub will provide a regional 'connector' in Manawatū-Whanganui between large scale infrastructure projects and a prepared, trained workforce, and facilitate any necessary training. The contract was signed on 6 June 2020.

He Poutama Rangatahi

The Ministry for Youth Development are consulting on their revised *Youth Plan 2020-2022: Turning Voice into Action – Rebuilding and Recovering* which is due to go to the Cabinet Social Well-Being Committee by the end of this month. The Ministry for Business, Innovation and Employment is also consulting on their Employment Strategy Report Back and Implications of COVID-19 which includes the *Youth Employment Action Plan*. This paper is due to go to the Cabinet Social Well-Being Committee.

He Poutama Rangatahi (HPR) projects feed into both cross-government plans because the projects help vulnerable rangatahi build their self-confidence, become 'work-ready' and get into training or employment. Wellbeing issues are also addressed as part of the programme. Additionally, some HPR projects specifically target those groups who will be heavily disadvantaged by the impacts of COVID 19 such as those with no qualifications, young wāhine and people with disabilities. Better linkages with the Oranga Tamariki *Transition to Independence* programme are also being encouraged through these action plans, with HPR programmes supporting work training for young people leaving care or the Justice System.
