Tairāwhiti Roads Programme	<p>A report on Tairāwhiti Roads from New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) was provided to Minister Jones for his Transport officials meeting on 17 October 2019. The Provincial Development Unit (PDU) has also received a report from Gisborne District Council's (GDC) CEO on the programme.</p> <p>These reports show that Tairāwhiti Roads is well ahead of the programme approved by Cabinet. Business cases required to confirm NLTF contributions and release the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) funds in contingency are due over the next <small>Commercial Information</small> years but will instead be completed in 2020.</p> <p>The second quarterly Contracts Management Board meeting for Tairāwhiti Roads Programme occurs 4 November 2019. <small>Commercial Information</small></p> <p><b>Amount:</b> \$137.000m   <b>Region:</b> Tairāwhiti   <b>Status:</b> Contracted</p>
Kaipara Kickstart Package - Roding	<p>PDU Officials met with Kaipara District Council (KDC) this week to finalise the second Roads agreement and look at acceleration options. PDU Officials visited Snow Tane from Te Roroa to look at the challenges around building Waipoua River Road (a private road owned by Te Roroa) and to better understand linkages with the project and timing. The road will need to be laid in the summer months, once the carpark has been built, in order to preserve the carpark's surfaces. Pacific Employment Support Service (PESS) (TAM)	<p>In February 2019, the Prime Minister announced that the Ministry of Pacific Peoples (MPP) would receive \$8.8m from Te Ara Mahi to expand their existing urban based PESS to the regions. To do this, MPP set up a dedicated team to review PESS to adapt it for the regions. It then undertook a revised procurement process for providers. PESS was renamed Tupu Aotearoa, and targets Pacific peoples in the regions aged 15-39 years to teach them new life skills, kick-start career prospects and provide employers with a skilled, motivated talent pool. On 26 July 2019, Hon Aupito William Sio, Minister for Pacific Peoples, announced the approval of seven contracts to expand Tupu Aotearoa to Waikato, Manawatu-Whanganui and Bay of Plenty. On 10 October 2019, Hon Sio announced the approval of four more providers to deliver Tupu Aotearoa in Hawke's Bay, Southland and Otago.</p>
