Hi there folks I should just like to make several observations for your consideration

Toilet paper should be priced by say per 100 sheets whereas currently it tends to shown the number of rolls in the package, takes no account for long rolls. Anything else where a package contains multiples of an item the DOQ should be per litre or kilo, I am thinking of say Watties Baked Beans wrapped 3 cans sold as a single unit.

The laundry powders liquids and capsules, dishwasher powder/tablets should be priced as per load. Dishwashing liquid again priced at per wash not liter given the disparity in amounts required. Additionally the amount required per load should be periodically quantified and tested against the claims.

Beers, I would like a per litre price as say I want DB Export I would buy the best priced be it bottles cans 6 packs 12 packs carton of 24 etc etc!

My local Pak N Save utilises an electronic sign which is fairly easy to read. Whereas the local Countdown utilise a printed card held in place by a plastic extrusion. The bottom and top couple of rows are impossible to readeven those at a good level usually/often have a thick part of the extrusion virtually obliterating the details.

Over some years I have highlighted discrepancies at both retailers and am firmly of the opinion that it is a pain for them to organise and only give lip service to the system much of the time. The discrepancies at PnS have decreased dramatically with the introduction of the electronic details placard. New World has new pricing on Mondays and more often than not the new pricing isn't on display for the first half day or more.

Quite happy to review any other thoughts you might have and/or check on situations locally.

Keep up the good work and I am looking forward to the resultant changes.
