



PERMITTING DECISION SUMMARY

StriX-4

Synspective Japan Inc.

- 1. Synspective Japan Inc. is a Japanese aerospace company, which specialises in Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) technology and data analytics. SAR is a form of radar that uses radio waves to create 2D images or 3D reconstructions of Objects and can captures images of the ground in all weather conditions.
- 2. StriX-4 is a mini-satellite equipped with a SAR antenna and will join Synspective operational constellation. Synspective operated a constellation of SAR satellites for the purpose of earth observation.
- 3. Payloads are permitted in line with the <u>Outer Space and High-altitude Activities Act 2017</u> and the <u>Outer Space and High-altitude Activities (Licences and Permits) Regulations 2017</u>.
- 4. Each payload has been approved by the Minister for Economic Development, on advice from officials across agencies. When approving payloads, the Minister needs to be satisfied that:
 - a. The applicant has taken and will continue to take all reasonable steps to safely manage the operation of the payload.
 - b. The proposed operation of the payload is consistent with New Zealand's international obligations; and
 - c. The applicant has an orbital debris mitigation plan that meets prescribed requirements.
 - d. Despite being satisfied of these matters, the Minister may nevertheless decline a permit if he is not satisfied that the proposed operation of the payload is in New Zealand's national interest.
