

Purpose

To provide further information on the timing of the offshore renewable energy regulatory regime, following our meeting on 20 May 2024.

Timeline

- 1. You have asked for further information on the timeline for the offshore renewable energy regime, including on the timelines we were working to since work began on the regime.
- 2. A summary of timelines is attached at **Annex One**.

We have developed our understanding of what is required since the first target was released under the Emissions Reduction Plan

- 3. The first Emissions Reduction Plan (ERP1) in May 2022 had a target of having the regime in place by July 2024.
 - ▶ Develop regulatory settings to enable investment in offshore renewable energy (such as offshore wind farms) and innovation. Regulatory settings are expected to be in place by July 2024.
- 4. At the time of the ERP1 commitment, work had not begun and a team had not been recruited to deliver the regime:
 - a. The May 2022 Budget included funding to establish the team to deliver the regulatory settings.
 - b. The first core members were in place in October 2022. A permanent manager started in May 2023.
- 5. At the time of the ERP1 target, the size, nature and legislative instruments required to enable offshore renewable energy was not known. Since then:
 - a. It became clear that new legislation and regulations would be required (i.e. it was not appropriate to amend existing regulations or legislation).¹
 - b. We have learnt more about what is required to deliver the regime, through policy work, studying overseas examples including Australia, engagement with industry and public consultation.
- 6. Under the previous Government, we had been working to a timeline of Cabinet policy decisions by the end of 2023. However, this timeline became unachievable because:
 - a. the timing of the second consultation was delayed (by two months to finish in November 2023), and
 - b. the size and complexity of the work required to enable policy decisions following further policy work became clear.
- 7. The legislative process for a new regime of this size would usually take around two years. In some cases, these processes can be compressed, i.e. under urgency. However, we would need to have a clear understanding of the policy settings and changes required we have been building this.
- 8. In short, the timelines have evolved as we have done the work required to build the regime.

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¹ At the time, we had looked at whether it would be possible to implement an interim regime to have the legislation in place faster, before a full regime was in place. However, this would also require new legislation.

The timelines we have provided you are ambitious

9.	The timelines we have presented are the minimum time we consider is required to deliver a credible regime. The timelines are ambitious. We run the risk of not achieving them if there are any unexpected events or issues.
10.	A clear, achievable timeline is the best thing we can offer developers to give certainty and maintain credibility. Developers have been anticipating the regime being in place and permits potentially being awarded in 2025. However, they have been through the process in other jurisdictions, including Australia, and understand what is required. Confidentiality

11.	The timeframes we have discussed above are about having the regulatory framework in place, including the legislation and regulations. We have only recently started work on the details of the implementation, including when the first permits can be allocated. An overview of the steps required to allocate the first permits is attached at Annex Two .
