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Background

- We have previously advised you on the implications of various funding profiles for geohazards data, information, and monitoring services [briefings 2324-2790, 2324-2883 refers].
- 2. Treasury has advised the following funding is being proposed for Geohazards services baselined from 2027/28.

2024/25	2025/26	2026/27	2027/28 & outyears

- 3. This funding maintains funding at levels approximately equal to 2023/24 levels for 2025/26 Confidential advice to Government
- 4. We have previously advised that maintaining funding at levels approximately equal to 2023/24 will result in downgrading of services [briefings 2324-2883 refers].
