The Fund's aim | Te Whāinga o te Tahua

- STRENGTHEN CAPABILITY, CAPACITY, SKILLS and NETWORKS
 between Māori and the science, innovation and technology system
- INCREASE UNDERSTANDING of how scientific research can contribute to the aspirations of Māori organisations and deliver benefit for Māori and New Zealand

Funding Available | He aha te pūtea e wātea ana?

Approximately \$2.0* million per year is available to fund successful new projects in the 2025 VMCF investment round

Projects up to 1 year can apply for a maximum of \$150,000*


Projects between 1 and 2 years can apply for a total of \$250,000*

^{*}Note all funding amounts are exclusive of GST

Updates to the 2025 investment round

- Applications submitted in Pītau
 - Get your access sorted early
 - Changes in terminology Application administrator etc.
- Emphasise scientific outcomes in addition to capability building
 - Science definition: Science is the pursuit and application of knowledge and understanding of the natural and social world following a systematic methodology based on evidence.

Investment Schemes | Ngā Kaupapa Haumitanga

Connect scheme | Kaupapa tūhono

Build <u>new</u> connections between Māori organisations and the science, innovation and technology system.

Placement scheme | Kaupapa ika tauhou

Enhance the development of an individual(s) through placement in a Partner organisation.

Existing relationships are eligible but the proposal needs to clearly go above business as usual and build new capability

- Eligibility checks
- Late October 2024
- Assessed by Independent Panel
- November-December 2024
- Assessment Panel meeting
- February 2025



Contracting Process



Accessing Pītau

- If you need access to Pītau:
 - Complete the Request for Access form, located on the Pītau portal webpage
 - Email the completed form to: <u>imssupport@mbie.govt.nz</u>
- Apply for access <u>EARLY</u>
 - We cannot guarantee requests will be processed the week of submission.
- Levels of access:
 - Organisation Administrator: authority to create and submit applications. Manage access to Pītau.
 - Organisation Member: can create and/or work on applications to which they are given access



Pitau Request for Access form

Pîtau is MBIE's Investment Management System – a secure online portal used to:

- apply for funding
 - manage your funding contracts
- submit funding reports
- submit invoices and expenses associated with funding contracts
- perform assessments.

If you are new to Pitau, you can request access in one of two ways:

- If your organisation has applied for MBIE funding before, contact your Research Office or Organisation Administrator as they should be able to give you access.
- If your organisation has never applied for MBIE funding, complete the details below and email it to imssupport@mbie.govt.nz.

If you are unsure if your organisation already has access, complete the form and email to us and we will let you know.

We will process your Request for Access form within 2 working days, Once your access has been processed, you will receive an email with login instructions and a unique Pitau activation code. To complete the login process, you will need a RealiNe account. If you have an existing RealiNe account please use it. If you do not have a RealiNe account, you will be directed to create one. Please note this does not have to be a verified account.



Assessment Panel Feedback from 2024

- QUALITY of applications remains HIGH, with a greater percentage of high scoring proposals, meaning COMPETITION IS HIGH.
- Heartened to see an increase in MĀORI TAKING THE LEAD IN PROJECTS
 - Important to show how Māori will lead/be the focus of the project
 - Need to clearly demonstrate how the capability and capacity of Māori researchers will be enhanced.
- Applicants should CLEARLY EXPRESS how the project team and/or organisations involved have the MANDATE TO CONDUCT THE WORK
 - Describe who has the mandate / scope of their mandate.
- Pleased to see a HIGHER RATIO OF FTE ALLOCATION FOR MĀORI, IWI AND HAPŪ
 MEMBERS in the project team
 - Encourage applicants to maintain this trend.

Feedback continued...

- Noted that information about INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT PLANS has improved in most circumstances.
 - Continue to take IP into consideration, particularly to ensure post contract benefits and better distribution of gains to Māori organisations.
- Still improvements to be made regarding ethical and tikanga considerations need to be considered for some projects involving iwi and hapū.
- DON'T LEAVE THE PREPARATION OF YOUR APPLICATION TO THE LAST MINUTE; allow time to check for obvious mistakes.
- Make sure that ALL RELEVANT INFORMATION IS PROVIDED in all sections of the application so that it ACCURATELY REPRESENTS THE PROJECT.

MBIE Advice

- READ all the provided documentation
- Clearly describe how your project is CO-DEVELOPED/CO-DESIGNED
- Describe how you will **DISSEMINATE** project findings
- EMPHASISE new partnerships / going beyond business as usual
- **HIGHLIGHT** science, outputs and outcomes of the project
- Ensure the TITLE accurately reflects the proposal aims, particularly the underpinning science
- Ensure that any ACRONYMS ARE DEFINED.
