# Comment

Actual spend of \$28.045 million is \$2.786 million (9%) under appropriation.

An In Principle Expense Transfer approved through the March Baseline Updates 2024 will be transferred to financial year 2024/25 and 2025/26 respectively, due to delay in the work programme across two financial year boundaries. This is the result of a mid-contract review and identification of significant emergent research challenges with the existing programmes.

# Comment

Actual spend of \$6.343 million is \$0.390 (7%) million over appropriation. The amount of funding expense incurred in excess of the appropriation is unappropriated expenditure. As a result of administrative errors at the Ministry, two contracts relevant to this programme were tracked as Departmental spending and therefore not managed against this appropriation. The errors will be corrected through the *Appropriation (2023/24 Confirmation and Validation) Bill* which will be introduced to the House later this year.

The following steps to prevent future errors re-occurring:

- An overhaul of internal budget tracking processes for the teams involved to ensure alignment with records in MBIE's financial system.
- Training on MBIE's financial processes.
- Issuing of reminders about MBIE, Treasury and Public Service Commission guidance on management of appropriations

Comment

This is a new multi-year appropriation added at the Supplementary Estimates 2023/24 for \$25 million to contribute funding towards the Institute of Environmental Science and Research Limited's Kenepuru facilities redevelopment.

The first tranche of \$10 million was paid to the Institute of Environmental Science and Research Limited in May 2024 and the second tranche of \$15 million is intended to be paid in the 2024/25 financial year, in accordance with the appropriation.

This appropriation is limited to providing loans to eligible businesses in anticipation of their research and development tax credit.

# What is intended to be achieved with this appropriation

This appropriation is intended to achieve the increase the value of the Research and Development Tax Incentive to recipients by allowing their entitlement to be paid in the same year as the Research and Development expenditure is incurred.

Comment

Following launch in March 2023, a total of 203 loans (\$42.6 million total value) have been issued to 127 unique R&D-performing businesses across New Zealand. In January 2024, the Minister of Science, Innovation and Technology agreed to terminate the scheme early as it was not delivering value for money and would have required further investment to maintain operations. All operations were finalised by 31 May 2024. MBIE is responsible for the management of the issued loans.

# Comment

This multi-year appropriation (MYA) is underspent by \$7.364 million (15%) in 2023/24.

This underspend was largely due to lower than anticipated uptake, i.e. when budgeted it was assumed that in the period April 2023 – May 2024 1,250 claims would be made. However, only a total of 203 claims were received, albeit with a larger average amount of \$210.030 instead of the originally estimated average amount of \$150,000.

No further loans will be issued and this MYA is going to expire.
