2023/24 Supplementary Estimates of Appropriations and 2024/25 Main Estimates: Vote Business, Science and Innovation – Media and Communications portfolio

Purpose

This briefing seeks your approval, in relation to appropriations in your Media and Communications portfolio, of:

- the financial information in the 2023/24 Supplementary Estimates of Appropriations and 2024/25 Main Estimates (together known as the Estimates), and
- changes to non-financial performance information (i.e. measures) to be incorporated into the Estimates.

Executive summary

On Budget Day 30 May 2024, the Estimates will be tabled in Parliament as part of Budget 2024.

The 2023/24 Supplementary Estimates include details of all new appropriations and changes to the existing appropriations in the current year since Budget 2023.

The 2024/25 Estimates of Appropriations (Main Estimates) include spending intentions for the next financial year and information to understand what is intended to be achieved with this spending.

All previously approved Ministerial decisions related to your portfolio are captured in the Estimates, including:

- October 2023 and March 2024 Baseline Update decisions,
- all Joint Ministers or Cabinet decisions approved before the Budget moratorium that begins on 29 April 2024,
- the Technical and Significant (Savings, Cost Pressures and "Other") initiatives included in the Significant Budget package approved by Cabinet on 29 April 2024.

Recommended action

The Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) recommends that you:

a **Approve** content related to your portfolio in the Estimates, as set out in Annexes 1 and 2

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Background

- 1. On budget day legislation is passed and documents are published showing the funding provided to Government agencies.
- 2. The Supplementary Estimates set out the changes to the 2023/24 financial year spending since Budget 2023. The 2024/25 Main Estimates detail all proposed spending for the next financial year, to be published at Budget 2024. The Estimates also include performance information for each appropriation (specific areas of spending within portfolios), explaining what is intended to be achieved with the funding.
- 3. The information in the Estimates supports Parliament's examination of appropriations for the forthcoming year. It also provides a base to assess what has been achieved with each appropriation at the end of the financial year.
- 4. This briefing presents the 2023/24 Supplementary Estimates and 2024/25 Estimates of Appropriations for Vote Business, Science and Innovation, which include details of appropriations you are responsible for as Minister for Media and Communications. These are attached as Annexes 1 and 2.
- Subject to your approval of the content related to your Media and Communications portfolio, you as the Minister for Economic Development, lead Minister for Vote Business, Science and Innovation, will submit the Estimates to the Minister of Finance by 1:00 pm on 26 April 2024 on behalf of all appropriation Ministers within the Vote.

Information in the Estimates

2023/24 Supplementary Estimates

- 6. The attached 2023/24 Supplementary Estimates (**Annex 1**) contains any changes since the prior year's Main Estimates were published at Budget 2023. These include:
 - new appropriations established during the year,
 - changes to baselines approved through the Baseline Updates in October 2023 and March 2024,
 - changes to non-financial performance information approved at MBU, and
 - other baseline changes and funding decisions made by Cabinet or joint Ministers which have an impact on the 2023/24 financial year.

2024/25 Main Estimates

- 7. The attached 2024/25 Main Estimates (**Annex 2**) set out the spending intentions for the next financial year and include:
 - financial details of all appropriations in your portfolio, including explanations for significant changes for next year compared to the current year,
 - for large appropriations, the components of appropriations above \$50 million,

- details of memorandum accounts, where applicable,
- non-financial performance information for each appropriation and each category of a multi-category appropriation, and where performance results will be reported at year-end, and
- information about current and past Budget initiatives.

Performance measures (non-financial performance information)

8. MBIE has identified some proposed changes to incorporate into the Estimates, as shown in **Annex 3**. These are subject to your approval and if not approved will be removed from the final version.

Significant Budget package

- 9. Some savings, Cost pressures, New Spending and "Other" initiatives for the Media and Communications portfolio are due to be considered by Cabinet on 29 April 2024. These are detailed in the table in Annex 4 and have been incorporated into the Main Estimates. We have included our current understanding of these initiatives and seek your approval to update the estimates documents as decisions are finalised by Cabinet.
- 10. No new appropriations in your portfolio will be established as part of the Significant Budget Package.

Next steps

- Subject to your approval, please sign and return this briefing to MBIE by 1:00 pm on 23 April 2024. This will enable MBIE to collate all changes and approvals for the Vote.
- 12. As the lead for Vote Business, Science and Innovation, Minister for Economic Development, you will submit the Estimates to the Minister of Finance on behalf of all appropriation Ministers in the Vote by **1:00 pm on 26 April 2024**.
- 13. If you, or other portfolio Ministers within the Vote, wish to make any changes to nonfinancial performance information, we will incorporate them into the Treasury's CFISnet system and generate new versions of the Estimates documents for the Vote Lead Minister to submit to the Minister of Finance.
- 14. MBIE has worked with Treasury officials in preparing the Estimates documents, however Treasury officials may provide us with feedback prior to the publication of the Estimates documents (after you have approved them). We have therefore sought your agreement to make minor (i.e. non-significant) corrections to address Treasury's feedback if required (see recommendation c above).

Budget approval process

15. On 29 April 2024, Cabinet will be asked to agree to detailed financial recommendations for Budget 2024.

- 16. The Budget moratorium will start from 29 April 2024. The Budget moratorium is the period beginning on the day Cabinet approves the Budget package and ending after the Minister of Finance has delivered the Budget, during which proposals for changes to appropriations or departmental capital injections cannot be submitted for consideration.
- 17. At that time no further changes to the Main Estimates will be allowed to be proposed to Cabinet or joint Ministers until after Budget Day, 30 May 2024.
- 18. No further changes to the Supplementary Estimates will be allowed once the Budget moratorium has started.

Note that many of the savings included in the table below are as a result of reductions to MBIE enablement and corporate services and other savings of a similar nature identified as part of the Government's Fiscal Sustainability Programme and Budget 2024 Exercise. These savings included:

- Property savings associated with reducing MBIE's property footprint
- ICT savings by reprioritising work and reducing the number of ICT contractors
- FTE reduction savings from closure of aged vacancies and the response to Government decisions to cease functions and programmes
- Discretionary and other savings including changing the approach to recruitment, travel, advertising, staff training, hosting, and attending conferences
